

NEW ORLEANS MUSEUM OF ART - To commemorate the fifth anniversary of Hurricane Katrina, the New Orleans Museum of Art will present an extraordinary exhibition: UNTITLED NEW ORLEANS & THE GULF COAST 2005] Photographs by Richard Misrach, Aug 28 - Oct 24, 2010. The show features sixty-nine color photographs of messages that people scrawled on roofs and walls, cars and trucks, fences and trees following the flooding of the city. Arranged by Misrach in a powerful narrative sequence, the images express, as the artist has stated, "people pleading for help, then defending their turf, then suffering human loss, then animal loss, then despair, then humor, then anger at the political establishment, then anger at the insurance companies, and finally determination and hope to survive and perhaps recover." Based in California, Richard Misrach is a nationally/internationally acclaimed American photographer. He was one of the pioneers in the creation of large-scale color photographs. The artist personally selected five museums to receive the generous donation of this group of images: the Museum of Modern Art, New York, the National Gallery of Art, Washington D.C., the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and the New Orleans Museum of Art. The artist will attend the premiere in New Orleans.


2011 will bring many new projects, all of which have not been identified quite yet as budgets are in progress.
